A Chronology of the Jews in Jackson, Tennessee By Joseph Wahl, MD April 2003

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This chronology was compiled March-August, 2003, on the basis of information found in Jackson City Directories; the collected papers of Sam Baum; and Emma Inman Williams' book; Historic Madison. Pam Dennis, Assistant Professor of Library Sciences at Lambuth University, made helpful suggestions concerning content. Anita Stamper, Professor of Family and Consumer Sciences at Lambuth University, patiently prepared the final product. David Crane, long-time resident of Jackson, and caretaker of our cemetery, clarified several of the listings. I am grateful to Jack Wood, Librarian, and Robert Taylor, Assistant Librarian, of the Tennessee Room, Jackson Public Library, for providing the research material. The author apologizes for any errors of omission.

Historical Note: The first Jew in Jackson, Tennessee was probably J. Friedlob, who arrived in 1867 to make arrangements for wagons to pick up goods which he was purchasing in Memphis. Also in that year, J. Solomon, a dealer in dry-goods and ladies' hats, advertised in a local newspaper. Furthermore, in 1935, leaders of the Jewish community concluded that a small congregation existed before 1885. Indeed, tombstone inscriptions in the cemetery on Madison Street confirmed the existence of a cemetery prior to 1875. In 1896, burial remains were transferred to the present cemetery site on Hollywood Blvd. A recent survey of the headstones by Joel Newman, president of Temple B'Nai Israel, confirmed the existence of burials dating from 1874.

Historical Note: In 1885 the religious needs of the growing Jewish community necessitated a Charter, which was recorded in Nashville on May 18, 1885 as "The Congregation B'Nai Israel", and signed by the following trustees: Julius Friedlob, Julius Samuels, Moses Tuchfeld, Sam Baum, Victor J. Woerner, Nathan Baum, and Harry Meyer. Plans were made to build a synagogue on property purchased on Cumberland Street, but finding itself financially unable, the Congregation traded the property, and \$600.00, to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church for their building on College Street; the deed was signed June 3, 1897. On March 12, 1907 the membership joined the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. The Temple's official spiritual leader was Rabbi Schrieber, who arrived in 1895. He was the first of thirty-four men that served through 1960. Since then, the spiritual leaders have been visiting rabbis or rabbinical students from the seminary in Cincinnati, Ohio. The Temple's current spiritual leader is Rabbi Marjorie Meyer, who commutes from her home in Cincinnati, Ohio.

# 1935

Known as the Hub City of West Tennessee, Jackson now has a population of 26,639 (including Bemis and Eastport). Racially, it is 2/3 White and 1/3 Black. Located in Madison County, it is named after our fifth president, James Madison. South of the city lie The Pinson Mounds, a reminder that in earlier times Madison County was an Indian hunting grounds. Jackson's first settlers arrived from middle Tennessee in 1819-1820, traveling by Indian Trails and Keel boats running on the Forked Deer River; the river was to become a shipping route for produce to Memphis, Cincinnati, and New Orleans. Jackson's institutions of higher learning are Lambuth College (Methodist), Union University (Baptist), and Lane College (Methodist). Methodists established the first church in Jackson in 1825; Baptists organized a church in 1836. In 1935 there were 33 churches in Jackson, including the only Jewish congregation, Temple B'Nai Israel, which had its beginnings in the late 1880's. The Temple was served by its first Rabbi in 1895. Its present site at the corner of Grand and Campbell was completed in September, 1941.

The number of Jewish families within the Jackson city limits has increased to 22. Location of their homes and residencies is further north of the downtown area, and include streets such as Arlington, Division, Fairmont, Grand, Johnson, Lambuth, Morningside Drive, Northwood, Park Avenue, Walnut, and Westwood. Four additional families reside in nearby Alamo (Levis), Bells (Wise), Humboldt (Strausberg), and Milan (Rubenstein).

On December 30, 1935, at the Jackson Country Club, Congregation B'Nai Israel held a gala celebration of its Golden Jubilee. Membership was listed as thirty-two families and thirteen singles. Temple officers were: J.S. Rosenbloom, president; A.S. Lindy, vice-president; A.J. Altfeld, financial secretary; A.M. Harris, recording secretary; HL. Altfeld, treasurer. Trustees were Aaron Tuchfeld, Louis Kisber, and Dr. Walter R. Levy. A Jackson Sun editorial stated: "The Jewish population has grown to become an essential part of our business and professional life. They are good citizens, industrious, frugal, charitable, law-abiding, and concerned for the common welfare."

#### 1950-52

Jackson's population has increased to 36,837. Surrounding the city is a thriving, highly diversified agricultural area. There are excellent banking and public transportation facilities. Bemis Brothers Bag Company employs over 1300. The Jackson Mall has been developed north of the downtown area. Expectation is that airline services will be established at McKellar Field. The number of Jewish families has decreased to 17, not including families residing in Alamo, Bells, Humboldt and Milan. The congregation's spiritual needs are served by visiting rabbis or rabbinical students.

Jackson's population has continued to grow. The Jackson Sun has 33,000 subscribers. There are five radio stations. WBBJ, the local television station, is an affiliate of the ABC network. Jackson State Community College and West Tennessee Business College provide additional education opportunities. The Civic Center seats 2500 for cultural events. The Coliseum seats 6000 for athletic events. Jackson has become a health care center for the 17 county West Tennessee area; facilities are centered around the Jackson-Madison County General Hospital, Parkway General Hospital, and Jackson Specialty Hospital, with a total bed capacity of 743. There is a Mental Health Center, a Speech & Hearing Center, and a facility for the handicapped. There are 16 private clinics; The Jackson Clinic is Tennessee's largest.
